


Snapshot of 40 Years Uplifting the Communities We Serve:





FINANCIAL REPORTS


Hospice and palliative care services are covered by Medicare, Medicaid and most insurance plans. Over 95% of our revenue is received from these programs. However, the entire cost of providing these valuable services is not always reimbursed. Contributions play a vital role in maintaining our commitment to providing hospice and palliative care to all individuals who request it - regardless of ability to pay.

Many of our services are not funded by third-party payors, such as our bereavement program, complementary therapies and Bridgeway program. As we expand our services and programs, we continue to serve the community with the highest quality of care, while maintaining a philosophy of fiscal responsibility.











How to English Others

Families are never denied care because of inability to pay. While Medicare, Medicaid, and many private insurance plans provide benefits to pay for hospice care, the cost of some patients' care often exceeds their reimbursement, and still other patients do not qualify for Medicare or Medicaid and do not have insurance coverage. Many of our community programs are largely uncompensated and depend on the generosity of our donors.

Community support through generous donations are vital to the function of our organization, and allows us the opportunity to continue to serve. Programs like our grief support and the addition of our Community Grief Center offer services to the entire community, completely free of charge. We are blessed to be able to offer these valuable services thanks to the generous donations we've received throughout the years.
