Dear Supporters of UpliftedCare,

As UpliftedCare entered their forty-first year serving the community in 2023, we placed a heavy focus on growth while also working to enhance our current skills and programs to continue bringing exceptional care to our patients and families.

In 2023, UpliftedCare introduced new legacy projects including the ever popular, "Sounds of the Heart" heartbeat recording program to help enhance the patient and family experience. Initiated by our Board-Certified Music Therapist, the patient's heartbeat is recorded using a special stethoscope and then set as the beat of a song of the families' choosing. This extremely powerful program offers a therapeutic experience for the patient and family and a lasting keepsake for them to hold dear after their loved one's death.

Our Music Therapy program is part of our Complementary Therapies provided to our patients free of charge. This program also includes massage therapy provided by two licensed Massage Therapists who use the power of touch to bring comfort and symptom relief to patients. Our Tails of Joy pet therapy program grew in 2023 adding seven new dogs and their dedicated handlers to see patients all throughout our service area. Our Respiratory Therapist assisted patients with many complex breathing issues that greatly impact their quality of life.

Ten years ago, the Kankakee Daily Journal published an article citing that 34% of all people who died in Kankakee County chose us for their hospice care. We are pleased and deeply humbled to share that in 2023, that number was nearly 60% - meaning nearly 60% of all of those families impacted by the death of a loved one received the care, compassion and comfort provided by our staff.

That support doesn't end at the time of death as bereavement services, provided by our knowledgeable team of grief support professionals, is then offered to those families for 13-months after their loss. Our grief support is also extended to those needing grief counseling in our community that have experienced a loss but did not receive support through our hospice or palliative services.

The UpliftedCare Community Grief Center has made great strides in expanding the programs and services offered to those needing grief support and continues to grow the number of clients served, year after year. Our three dedicated counselors worked hard in 2023 to enhance the grief support services to help reach more people. Some new programs for 2024 include monthly workshops on various topics, additional modalities of therapy including yoga and music and a regular weekly support group schedule for many different types of grief and loss. We have been truly blessed to be part of this amazing community for over four decades. Our impact is evident by the trust people continue to place in the care that we provide and we are honored to detail that impact in the 2023 UpliftedCare Annual Report.



## Complementary Therapies











#### **MASSAGE**

UpliftedCare has two licensed massage therapists who provide support to our patients using the power of touch. These services extend far beyond a typical "spa" massage and include many modalities for pain and symptom management.

#### **MUSIC**

Our Board Certified Music Therapist uses music to connect with her patients and families. Through therapeutic practices our music therapist performs activities and life review to bring peace and comfort. In 2023, the powerful program "Sounds of the Heart" was initiated to record the patient's heartbeat and set it to a song of their choosing - leaving families with a lasting keepsake to hold dear.

#### **RESPIRATORY**

Respiratory illnesses can cause a lot of stress and discomfort for patients and families. Our licensed respiratory therapist is an expert in helping manage complex respiratory symptoms to help ease discomfort and provide peace to those struggling to breathe.

#### **TAILS OF JOY**

Our Tails of Joy Therapy Teams include a specially trained dog and their amazing human handler. These dogs come in all sizes and provide a sense of cuddly comfort to our patients and families. Our therapy dogs also help out at the UpliftedCare Community Grief Center,

Community Grief Center, greeting clients, participating in groups and just being available for a pet or cuddle throughout the day.

#### **VETERAN CARE**

As a member of the We Honor Veterans Program through the National Hospice & Palliative Care Association, UpliftedCare recognizes the unique needs that veterans face - especially at the end of life. We utilize a dedicated veteran plan of care to ensure that every veteran patient's individual needs are met and their service is recognized with the utmost dignity, respect and honor.

## HEARTBEAT RECORDING

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Navigating the world of hospice and palliative care was something that 27-year-old, Emily VanGlider, never thought she'd experience so soon. When her mother Christina received a terminal diagnosis, it turned their whole world upside down.

Enlisting the help of palliative care first, then hospice support from UpliftedCare, Emily beautifully documented their journey in a powerful testimonial video as part of UpliftedCare's Courageous Conversations series in November of 2023.

Emily's family was the first to have the opportunity to be part of the Sounds of the Heart program where Christina's heartbeat was recorded and set to a song the family chose. In their case, it was Christina's grandmother's favorite song, Amazing Grace.

Board Certified Music Therapist, Megan Cipich used a special recording stethoscope to record Christina's heartbeat and used it as the beat to record herself singing *Amazing Grace*. The song was then uploaded to a digital format that could be shared throughout Emily's family - especially with her two sisters.

This powerful new program is another beautiful example that hospice care offers so much more than people may think and we are honored to be giving this lasting gift to families like Emily's.




